Eastern Tiger Salamander



OVERVIEW



- · Scientific Name: Ambystoma tigrinum tigrinum
- · Origin: North America
- · Ease of Care: Intermediate
- · Potential Adult Size: 6-10 inches
- · Life Span: 10 to 20 years
- · Behaviour: Nocturnal
- Diet: Insectivore
- Handling: Advanced (only if necessary)







TOP TIPS

- Provide low-level logs, branches, cork tubes and bark for enrichment within the enclosure
- Add live plants, leaf litter and pockets of damp moss to help maintain humidity
- Make sure to add a deep level of substrate to allow the Eastern Tiger Salamander to dig and burrow naturally.
- ✓ The Eastern Tiger Salamander can be sensitive to chemicals (such as chlorine) within our tap water, so any water used should be treated with a suitable water conditioner such as Exo Terra Aquatize (DEA120).

HOUSING



Individual - HabiStat Glass Terrarium 60 x 45x 45cm (HGT6045)

Two – HabiStat Glass Terrarium 91.4 x 45.7 x4 5.7cm (HGT9145)

EQUIPMENT NEEDED



- · Housing: Vivarium
- · Heating: Heat Mat
- · Thermostat: Mat Stat
- Lighting: UV Tube (Light Cycle: 12 hours of light)
- Substrate: HabiStat Coir, Arcadia EarthMix Arid
- Water: HabiStat Sandstone Water Dish

ENVIRONMENT

Enclosure Readings

- · Hot Spot: 25-28°C (79-84°F)
- Background Temp: 20-25°C (77-82°F)
- Night-Time Temp: 20-23°C (68-73°F)
- · Humidity: 70%
- UVI: 1-2

Heating

The Eastern Tiger Salamander (*Ambystoma* tigrinum tigrinum) is considered a nocturnal amphibian and requires a suitable light gradient in the enclosure to simulate a complete 24-hour period.

Usually, no additional heating is required, and room temperature is more than adequate.

If the ambient background temperature drops below the recommended range, add a HabiStat Heat Mat (HHM11) on the outside rear of the terrarium.

Use the Heat Mat in conjunction with a HabiStat Mat Stat (HTMB1).

Mat Stat Thermostats are designed to regulate temperatures using a thermostat probe (also known as a sensor).

Correct placement of the probe is critical to avoid overheating and injury to the animal.

Check temperatures and humidity regularly using a reliable thermometer and hygrometer to ensure that there are no extreme fluctuations.

Lighting

Use the Arcadia Pro T5 UVB Max Kit ShadeDweller 2.5% (RARTP14S), or alternatively the Arcadia LumenIZE Pro T5 UVB Max Kit ShadeDweller 2.5% (RARLZ14S) ShadeDwelleron top of the mesh.

Ensure that it is fitted correctly and within the manufactures recommended distances, providing a UVI of 1-2

Substrates and Decoration

Personal choice will dictate how you decorate your enclosure, but we recommend the following as examples:

- HabiStat Coir (HSC10F), Arcadia EarthMix Arid (RAREA10), with areas using HabiStat Sphagnum Moss (HSM1)
- HabiStat Grapevine (HSGV) and HabiStat Cork Bark (HDCB5)
- Live or artificial plant decoration will provide darker areas for the Eastern Tiger Salamander to use as shelter

DIET & WATER



Ensure the Eastern Tiger Salamander is offered a variety of insects.

Young/Juvenile – Several appropriately sized feeders 2 to 3 times per week such as:

- · Earth Worm
- · Locust 1st Hopper
- · Calci Worms

Adult – 4 or 5 appropriately sized feeders per week such as:

- · Crickets Standard
- · Locust 3rd Hopper
- · Earth Worm

SUPPLEMENTATION



Following a supplementation regime that involves calcium and multivitamin powders such as HabiStat Pure Calcium (HMC40), HabiStat Reptavite (HMRV40), HabiStat Repton (HMR40) and Arcadia Earth Pro-A (RAREP100) will be beneficial to the health and wellbeing of the animal.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION



- Make sure to add a deep level of substrate to allow the Eastern Tiger Salamander to dig and burrow naturally.
- The Eastern Tiger Salamander can be sensitive to chemicals (such as chlorine) within our tap water, so any water used should be treated with a suitable water conditioner such as Exo Terra Aquatize (DEA120).

HEALTH & HYGIENE



We recommend the following cleaning routine to keep your Eastern Tiger Salamander healthy and happy:

	Water	Substrate	Enclosure
Daily	Change old water for fresh water	Spot clean	Check vents on enclosure are not blocked and allow air to pass through freely
Weekly		Agitate substrate to prevent any bacterial build-up and remove any dirty bedding	Wipe down glass walls with a cloth
Monthly		Take out old substrate and replace with new substrate	

Always wash your hands, surfaces and equipment with warm water and disinfectant immediately before and after handling or feeding your Eastern Tiger Salamander, their food, enclosure and any other equipment using HabiStat Anti-Bac Spray (HABS) for any surface and HabiStat Sanitiser (HABG) for hands.
